4. Onions: Dressed 250g or under (5)
5. Onions: Dressed over 250g (3)
6. Shallots: (10)
7. Garlic: 3 bulbs
8. Potatoes: White (5)
9. Potatoes: coloured (5)
10. Potatoes: 3 dishes of 3 potatoes, each dish a different variety
11. Runner Beans: (9)
12. Beans: French, climbing or dwarf (9)
13. Sweetcorn (2)
14. Tomatoes: medium (4)
15. Tomatoes: small fruited (8)
16. Tomatoes: 3 dishes of 3 tomatoes, one dish each of small, medium and large/beefsteak varieties
17. Cabbages: green, red or Savoy (2)
18. Courgettes: (3) 10cm - 20cm/4in - 8in long
19. Marrow or Squashes: 1 pair
20. Rhubarb: 3 sticks
21. Any other vegetable, for example: cucumbers, peppers, aubergines etc., numbers not less than half as per RHS Handbook.

SHOW RULES

1. The Show will be conducted in accordance with the Rules and Standards contained in the RHS Horticultural Show Handbook 2016.
2. The Show is open to all amateur gardeners.
3. Entry fees 20p per entry, Children free.
4. Entry forms must be submitted to the Show Secretary by 8pm on Thursday 15th August 2019
5. An Exhibitor may stage only one entry in any one class.
6. All exhibits to be staged between 8.45am and 10.45am on the day of the show.
7. All dishes and containers to be supplied by the Exhibitor, unless otherwise stated. Whilst the Committee will endeavour to take all care, they cannot accept responsibility for any damage or loss to either exhibits or accessories.
8. Jars of Preserves to be filled to the top. Metal screw tops are acceptable. Care to be taken with presentation and jars to be labelled with type and date.
9. All entries in classes 1 – 26 and 28-47 must be grown by the Exhibitor.
10. All floral arrangements will be judged according to NAFAS rules
11. All tables to be cleared of exhibits by 4.30pm but not before the presentation of the awards.

HINTS TO EXHIBITORS

- Vegetables: All exhibits should be clean and free from soil
- Runner Beans: Young, straight and of uniform length with stalks attached attached
- Onion: Good, Uniform size, thin necks. Do not skin.
Autumn sown and sets should be dressed
Spring sown – if leaves have dried they should be dressed
- Beetroot, Carrots
and Parsnips: Leave the tap root on and approx. 10cm (4”) of top
- Tomatoes: Leave on calyces
- Flowers: Fresh and free from greenfly etc.
- Fruit: Ripe, leave on stalks. Do not polish.

PLEASE READ THE SCHEDULE CAREFULLY BEFORE STAGING EXHIBITS.

NOTES FOR GUIDANCE OF EXHIBITORS

HANGING BASKETS/CONTAINERS – Class 27

Baskets and containers must have been planted by the exhibitor and not purchased. Please do not water the baskets or containers prior to bringing them along to the show. The baskets will be displayed on large pots as there is no hanging space in the hall

DAHLIA CLASSIFICATIONS

These are simplified descriptions of dahlia types to help with identification.

SINGLE FLOWERED

Single outer ring of petals which may overlap, the centre forming a disc

ANEMONE-FLOWERED

One or more outer rings of petals surrounding a dense group of tubular petals

COLLERETTE

A single outer ring of flat petals with a ring of smaller petals and the centre forming a disc

WATERLILY

Fully double blooms with slightly spiralling, generally broad petals resembling a waterlily

DECORATIVE

Fully double blooms showing no centre. The petals are generally broad and flat

BALL

Fully double blooms, ball shaped or slightly flattened, spirally arranged

POMPON

Fully double spherical blooms of miniature size not exceeding 50mm in diameter

CACTUS

Fully double blooms where the petals are usually pointed
